All	All states and territories require an operator to hold a High Risk Work Licence – Mobile Slewing Crane with appropriate class for the capacity of the Telehandler - HRWL Class C2/C6/C1/C0 = Mobile Slewing Crane (≤20t, ≤60t, ≤100t, >100t)		
All Telehandler Attachment Combinations			
If you are intending to use an over 3t rated capacity Telehandler with an under 3t crane jib, you will need to seek a ruling from your State/Territory WHS/OHS Regulator as to whether a CN Licence is required and whether your control measures are sufficient. If you are hiring this machine combination, <b>you should ask your rental company for this information.</b>			
All attachment combinations must be manufacturer approved for use on the Telehandler and the appropriate load charts provided.
